- **Japanese Knotweed:** The Coalition Knotweed Project continues on Lake Parkway with the participation of the Hogan & Icke families.

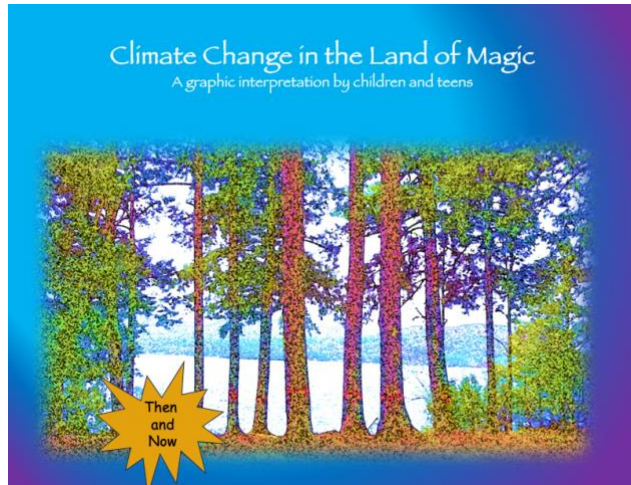
Most of the area has been covered with tarps following repeated cutting by the

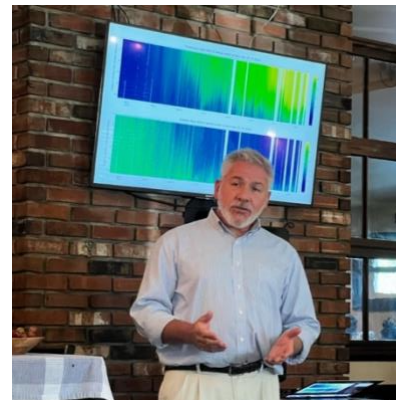
